

Foreword

This glossary contains medical terminology, specifically related to cancer, developed by and for people of the Sahtú regions. The K'áshó Got'íné Charter Community, Tulít'a Dene Band, Goba Group, and Government of the Northwest Territories Department of Health and Social Services, with financial support from the Canadian Partnership Against Cancer, partnered to create this resource, providing language to speak productively about cancer.

The desire to establish cancer terminology in Sahtú dialects was initiated by the community of Fort Good Hope and the Goba Group in 2013 and followed up with a workshop in Fort Good Hope in 2016. From January 19-21, 2016 a group of 13 language speakers and Elders, representing each of the Sahtú communities, gathered to discuss how to speak about cancer in the Sahtú dialects. Ms. Lucy Ann Yakeleya served as interpreter/translator and the Cancer Care Coordinator from Stanton Territorial Hospital provided cancer expertise. Fibbie Tatti joined the project as a second interpreter/translator shortly after the terminology development workshop.

On January 31, 2017, another workshop was held in the community of Tulít'a to review and validate the translated terminology.

This resource is developed for the Sahtú, by the Sahtú. Participants and partners have expressed their desire to continue developing cancer terminology in the region. For this reason, this resource is being released in a draft format to communities so they may continue to build on the terms identified in this glossary.

This project was not possible without the efforts and contributions of the workshop participants who shared their expertise, and the interpreter/translators who captured the information.
